


Who We Are

Our innovative approach addresses the distinct needs of each family member, preparing mothers and their children for long-term stability and independence.

Our Services

Redefining what investing in families signifies.

- 1. HOUSING**
Emergency, Transitional & Rental Housing with Services.
- 2. YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS (ages 6 to 19)**
 - After School
 - Full Day Summer
 - Teen Programs
 - Girls Groups
- 3. TRAINING & EDUCATION**
Skill building classes and workshops.
- 4. WOMEN'S SAFETY NETWORK**
Provides culturally specific services for families homeless due to domestic violence.
- 5. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH**
Licensed clinicians and graduate-level interns deliver trauma-informed individual, group and family services.
- 6. COMMUNITY SERVICE**
Brookview also opens its education, training & youth programs to area residents and schools, to help those at risk of homelessness stay at work and housed. As a result we're stabilizing the community as we're helping families thrive.


